Also give my said daughter Sarah one hundred and six dollars and sixty six cents to be paid to

her one year after my death or sooner if she wants it. Secondly I give and bequeath to my son Derrick Barcalow one bed and bedding and curtain the next choice after the above said Sarah and the Mimrod (Nimrod) Colt and my gun and two hundred dollars the money to be paid when arrives at twenty one years of age. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son John Barcelow sixty Dollars to be paid six months after my death - Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son William Barcalow a coat jacket and breeches that formerly belonged to his Uncle Lefferd Polhemus - Fifthly I order and direct my executor herin after to sell all the residue of my estate both real and personal in one year after after my death. Sixthly my will further is that the negros much left after Sarah has her choice may live with any my children if she choses till she is thirty years of age and then she is to be free and --house of them she chooses to live with are to pay my executor for her the value there of. Seventh my will further is that after all my estate both real and personal be told as above mentioned and my funeral charges and l--t debt paid all the residue and remainder namely first Elenor Beard Secondly William Barcalow, Thirdly Tobias Barcalow, Fourthly John Barcalow and Sixthly Derrick Barcalow to be equally divided among them to be paid to said Elinor Beard and William Barkalow their shares six months after the sale of my said estate and the other (therins?) in eighteen months after the date I appoint James Brewer my son Tobias Barcalow and my brother David Barcalow Executor of my last will and testament. She was born in Crittenden county, Ky. On 03/03/1863 she married Anderson Avitts. The records list Weston in Crittenden county, Ky as the place of marriage. "West-town" as the early name implies, was most important as a river port for western Kentucky pioneers before the Jackson Purchased opened in the 1820s. Incorporated as a town in 1854, it developed around Flynn's Ferry at the Ohio River crossing of the old Slaine Trace. As the age of river trade faded so did the "Weston". They had a daughter, Laura Voden Avitts (RIN: 491) on 11/03/1868 in New Market, IL in Gallitan county. Rebecca died there 07/04/1873 at the age of 29.

Rebecca's husband enlisted, near Springfield, IL in Company "E" of the 48th Illinois Infantry (address; Ford's Ferry, Ky.) on September 1, 1861. The unit played a very active role in the conflict. He re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer on January 1, 1864 at Scottsborough, Al. He was wounded in the right thigh in a skirmish on November 20th and returned to duty on December 1st.

The following is a paraphrase excerpt from the Report of the Adjunct General of the state of Illinois, VOL III. "The forty-eighth Infantry Illinois Volunteers was organized at Camp Butler, Illinois in the month of September 1861, by Colonel Isham N. Haynie. The Regiment left Camp Butler, Cairo, November 11, 1861, nine hundred strong, and at its arrival, constructed barracks for winter quarters. {It} was the first Federal Regiment that formed a line of battle in Tennessee at Fort Henry in February 1862. The ensuing battle with repeated charges, one retreat, then victory, cost the regiment 40 killed and wounded. They then moved with General McClelland's Division to Savannah and Pittsburgh Landing. On April 6 and 7 bearing their full part in the battle of Shiloh, half the unit was lost, killed or wounded. They then traveled north to memphis, before receiving orders to march 400 miles to Chattanooga. After the battle of Mission Ridge, the were ordered to Knoxville. Without rations, blankets or overcoats and only half with shoes, they marched 270 miles. Blankets, jackets and trousers were used to protect their feet from the sharp rocks and snow. They moved to Scottsboro,

Alabama, barely recovered; there 90% (including Anderson Avitts) re-enlisted as veteran volunteers. They were furloughed for 3 months in Illinois. Reassembling in March 1864, they moved over two months to Georgia. They participated in the siege of Atlanta in July and August of 1864 and moved with General Sherman on his "March to the Sea." They made their way up the coast to Washington, D.C. then to Virginia to Louisville, Ky. On June 25, 1865 they were moved to Little Rock, mustered out on August 15th and moved to Camp Butler for final discharge August 21, 1865. They had Marched 3,000 miles and moved 5,000 miles by water and 3,450 miles by rail" [1]

The previous excerpt was sent to me by David Stumpf, M.D., Ph.D., Evanston, IL

Anderson Avitts became very sick with diabetes mellitus after the war and apparently withered away from its effects. Caroline died in July, 1873 leaving him with 3 small children. He remarried Margaret P. Cain while quite ill in January 1874. This may have been a marriage to insure his children would be cared for. His health deteriorated until his death in 1877. He is buried in the Mt. Zion Cemetery where his grave is marked by a veteran's stone. His widow's pension application describes the tragic chronology of his life with a now treatable disease.

"I was married to Anderson Avitts Jan 11, 1874. His health was very bad at that date. Was taken down about Aug 1876. Was not able to walk any after that date. Was under the care of Dr. S. M. Truitt and took medicine continuously. His symptoms as I remember them were as follows - constant thirst - could drink water continually. Ravenous appetite. Could eat more than two well men. Craved candy sugar and molasses (sic)- passed at least five gallons of urine per day -- urine contained so much sugar that it was sticky and could be smelled anywhere about the house. His breath was very oppressive. He had pain in back and hips, his feet and legs were swollen the last week or two that he lived. He was reduced to a mere skeleton and his skin was dry. Dr. Truitt is dead but he told me frequently that my husband had diabetes or sugar of the liver. My husband died Nov 27, 1877.

After Caroline's death, the Avitts grandchildren moved to Texas with their step-mother. Laura Avitts probably moved there later, about 1893. There was one child with Margaret Cain. After Anderson's death, Margaret left for Erath Co., TX to join the Burklow's who moved in the early 1870s. There she lived on her widow's pension of \$8.00 until her death on May 4, 1907.

I only have information on two of their children. Leroy W. Burklow born in 1823 and Rebecca A. Burklow 1826. According to Beverly Burklow Goodly, Ilias was also a son of Isaac and Phebe. There is an Elias, age 20, listed with Phoebe in the Crittenden County Census of 1850. Leroy Married Harriet Bealmear and Rebecca married Chesterfield Ragsdale. By the 1850 census Isaac had dropped the "Van" prefix and was listed as living with his son Leroy and his family.

Isaac died sometime after the Crittenden County Census of 1850 and before January 1, 1851. No

records of Isaac's or Phoebe's deaths or where they are buried have been found. After Isaac' death Phoebe married Rivers Banks in April of 1851. Rivers Banks listed his state of birth as South Carolina and his year of birth as 1780 in the Crittenden County Census of 1860. According to records found by Roseann Hogann, Isaac Burklow appears in Leroy and Harriet's household in the 1850 census. His age is listed as 50 and born in Kentucky. (1800).

"Private Isaac Burkelow" is listed in Kentucky Soldiers of the war of 1812. He was in the 6th Regiment of Babour's Kentucky Militia in Captain Thomas Stokes' Company. He was enlisted on 09/01/1812 and records indicated that he was discharged on 12/23/1812. According to National Archive MILITARY RECORDS, Isaac served from 09/01/1812 through 12/23/1812 in BARBOUR'S KENTUCKY VOLUNTEER'S, which was part of the 6th Regiment. The Muster Roll was "Roll dated" Henderson, KY. Isaac listed his place of residence as being 45 miles from Henderson, KY. In the remarks area it noted he was, "allowed 6 days travelling". Isaac's term of service was 3 months and 29 days. His pay for service as a Private was \$6.66 per month. His total pay due at the time of his discharge was \$26.42. There was also a John Burklow serving in the same unit. There service was for exactly the same dates. John was listed as a substitute for Samuel Craig.

It has been said he was wounded at the Battle of New Orleans. This has not been verified through records. In papers sent to me, from David A Stumpf,M.D.,PhD., this is an indication that this may be true. Isaac also saw service in the Tennessee Militia as a Private. He first enlisted on 05/26/1814 and was discharged on 12/20/1814. It is noted in his affidavit to collect his last pay that he served in the war against the "Creek Nation of Indians." He served for a total of 7 months and 7 days at a rate of \$8 per month. This came to a total of \$57.80. [1] Historically, this is consistent. The battle for New Orleans commenced with the landing of 14,000 British troops on the shores of Lake Borque on 12/16/1814. The British began to advance on New Orleans but were delayed when General Jackson led a night attack against them. About five miles from New Orleans, General Jackson built a line of fortifications. By the time the British force of 5300 attacked the 4500 entrenched U.S. troops it was January 8, 1815, Isaac had already been discharged. This could have been do to wounds he received in the earlier battles for New Orleans.

Reynier is buried in Friends Burying Place, Bombay Hook, DE at Ducks Creek. His widow married John James, A Baptist and a Welshman. He was a carpenter by trade. The Van Burkelow families were Quakers.

Reynier worked with Daniel Pastories who had a land grant from William Penn and the King and Queen of England. The land grant was given with the understanding that Reynier and Daniel would persuade Dutch and German people to settle on the land. They founded the town of Germantown, PA. which is now part of Philadelphia, PA. At this point Reynier begins to spell his name "Van Burklow". In 1691 Reynier applied for naturalization papers as a citizen of the Colony of Pennsylvania. (reference: PA. archives)

It was while he was living in Pennsylvania that he married Mary Schumacher. She was the daughter and 6th child of a Peter Schumacher who was an emigrant from Kregheem (sp?) Germany. After the contract was finished Reynier and Mary (not sure which Mary) moved to Maryland. While in Maryland Reynier and his Mary went together with the Van Bibber brothers and bought property that was part of what was known as "Bohemia Manor". In later years Reynier sold his interest in Bohemia Manor. (According to the PA. Archives at this point he moved to New Jersey where he died)
