

Jannecken ten Olinckhave

Jan Bernts Lubberdinck

According to “Bunnell and Allied Families” by Joan England Murray: “Jannecken, mother of Harmen Hanse Van Barkeloo, married Jan Bernts Lubberdinck on 2 April 1617. Although the marriage record appears in the Lochem Dutch Reformed Church, the record indicates the couple were married at Giestren (local dialect) for Geesteren where Jan Lubberdinck was a resident.”

From Ms. Murray’s publication, the children of Jan and Jannecken were: Bernt Jansz, born circa 1618; Willem Jansz, born 1621; Harman Jansz, born circa 1626 and married 1656 to Willemken Warners and died 1670 in New Utrecht, New York; Gerrit Jansz, born circa 1626, married October 15, 1654 to Jans Bruinick; and Geertruijdt Jansd, born circa 1633, married January 23, 1670 to Jan Hendricksz Roosinck.

The same publication indicates : “ The will of Jan’s parents is found in the same court records (Borculo District Court). Dated 8 November 1627, Berndt Lubberdinck and his wife, Toniske, made a will to the living children with each child receiving equal portions of their estate. The children were not named. Hermanus van Keppel was appointed as testator. It has been suggested that perhaps he was in some way related to the wife Toniske.”

The above listed publication indicates that Jannecken died before 1653 as Jan married for a second time on November 6, 1653. The marriage record can be found in the Geesteren Dutch Reformed Church. He married Geesken Roosinck, daughter of the late Aerent Roosinck from Mallen. The couple had four children: Jan on February 24, 1654; Arent, on November 4, 1655; Berentje, on July 5, 1657; and another Arent, on September 9, 1660.
